popular (adj): liked or enjoyed by many people

convenient (adj): helpful, makes life easier

service: how food is served/given to customers

dine-in: a kind of service where you can eat the food inside the restaurant

curbside pick-up/take out or **delivery**: a kind of service where you can order your food on the phone or restaurant's website, then drive to the restaurant, and someone from the restaurant will bring your order to you in your car, or you can have the food delivered to your home for an extra fee.

drive-thru: a kind of service where you order your food from your car, then drive to a window where you receive your food
