

Most Popular Social Media in the US [Updated May 2023] (oberlo.com)

Today, in the United States, Facebook is the most popular social media site. Mark Zuckerberg, the creator of Facebook, started his network in 2004 when he was a student at Harvard University. He **realized** that students wanted to be able **to find out** about their friends' thoughts and activities. By 2007, Facebook had 70 million users. Today, Facebook has 2.99 billion users!

When asked, "Why did you join this site?", here is how some people answered:

- It's a good way to find people with similar interests.
- I can share photos and videos with my friends and make comments
- I can see what friends we have in common.
- I can hear about events from my friends.
- I can share my favorite links with my friends.

- Mom 1: Hey, have you considered letting your kids use Messenger to stay **connected** with friends and family? It's been really **helpful** for us.
- Mom 2: Oh, I'm a little unsure about it. Why do you think it's a good idea?
- Mom 1: Well, there are a few reasons. First, it allows them to message friends in a controlled environment, which is better than some other less **secure** messaging apps. You can also set up a kids' Messenger account for more safety.
- Mom 2: That sounds good. I've heard about some safety concerns with other apps. How does the kids' Messenger account work?
- Mom 1: It's great! You can create a Messenger Kids account linked to your own Facebook or Instagram account, and you have control over their contacts and messages. You can approve or deny their friends, set time limits, and monitor their activity.
- Mom 2: That's a relief. I was worried about who they might be talking to online. Can you also monitor their messages?
- Mom 1: Yes, you can. You have the ability to see who they're chatting with and what they're sending. It's a good way to make sure they're using it safely.
- Mom 2: How about privacy concerns?
- Mom 1: Messenger Kids is designed with privacy in mind. It doesn't display ads, and Facebook claims they don't use kids' data for advertising purposes. Plus, you can control their privacy settings.
- Mom 2: That's good to know. But what if my kids want to use it on their own devices?
- Mom 1: You can install Messenger Kids on their own devices too and manage it from your account. It's pretty convenient.
- Mom 2: That sounds pretty easy. I'd like to try it. Thanks for the info!
- Mom 1: You're welcome! It's been a helpful tool for us to keep our kids connected in a safe and controlled environment. If you have any questions when setting it up, feel free to ask.
